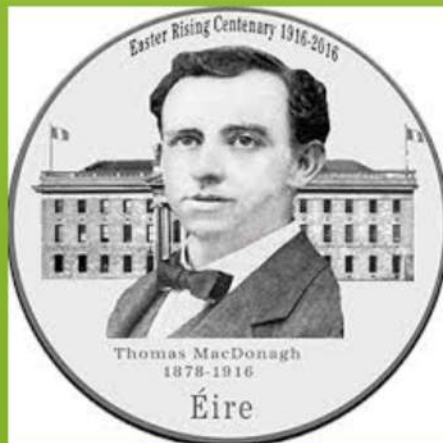


## Welcome to this year's Heritage week
